

All PDUs must be aligned with at least one of the Knowledge Statements or Task Statements found in the *AHIC™ Outline of Exam Topics*. PDUs are an AMIA AHIC measurement and are calculated as noted below:

CATEGORY 1: Coursework / Continuing Education Activities

(training that is required for work responsibilities does not earn PDUs)

Activity	PDUs
University graduate courses that offer academic credits, including AMIA 10x10 Virtual Informatics Education	5 / course credit hour earned (3 credit hours = 45 hours of educational time)

<p>Recertification Application Documentation Required: Title, dates, role, time involved, organization. Audit: If a recertification application is selected for an audit, the diplomate will be required to submit supporting documents, such as: A copy of presentation slides, abstract, letter inviting the diplomate to speak, or evidence demonstrating that the diplomate presented; a copy of the claimed publication; or a letter attesting to the claimed service, with a description of how this service demonstrates the diplomate’s enhancement of HI knowledge, skills, or abilities.</p>
