Clinical Informatics Program Directors (CIPD) is the home for the Clinical Informatics Fellows Match. The community provides leadership for the ACGME Clinical Informatics Programs or future programs. Throughout the year, CIPD Members provide ongoing CI Fellows training bringing in fellows from across the U.S. .

Academic Leaders in Nursing Informatics (ALNI). ALNI strives to create an environment that encourages the development of fellowships in Clinical Informatics and supports the continued evolution of these programs.

Biomedical and Health Informatics Academic Leaders (BMI-Leaders) facilitates professional networking and provides a forum for those responsible for the leadership and management of academic units. Members share their expertise, support benchmarking data, position statements, best practices and other shared standards within a private, secure community.

Professional Master’s Educators (PMEC) shares expertise with educators and leaders. PMEC supports the creation of bench marking data, position statements, best practices and other shared standards to improve the structure and function of their academic programs.
