**Title:** Health Informatics Specialists

#### Explanation of Assignment:

An Occupational Code Assignment (OCA) is a process established to help occupational information users relate a job title or occupational specialty to an existing O\*NET-SOC occupation that most closely matches or fits to the more specific job title. The Occupational Information Network (O\*NET) is a SOC (Standard Occupational Classification) based system, currently SOC 2018. Note that the information gleaned from OCA requests goes into a database that may be used to inform future updates or additions to the O\*NET-SOC taxonomy.

The O\*NET-SOC linked to the establishment title “Clinical Informatician/Informaticist”, is based on the analysis of occupational information contained in OCA Form Part A. Based on the information provided, this occupation appears to best fit with the O\*NET title Health Informatics Specialists O\*NET Code 15-1211.01, described as: “Apply knowledge of nursing and informatics to assist in the design, development, and ongoing modification of computerized health care systems. May educate staff and assist in problem solving to promote the implementation of the health care system.”

The sample of reported job titles for this O\*NET occupation includes: Clinical Informatics Analyst, Clinical Informatics Nurse, Clinical Informatics Specialist, Clinical Informatics Systems Analyst, Digital Diabetes Research Officer, Nursing Informatics Officer, Nursing Informatics Specialist, Nursing Information Systems Coordinator, Registered Nurse Clinical Information Systems Coordinator (RN Clinical Information Systems Coordinator), Registered Nurse Clinical Information Systems Educator (RN Clinical Information Systems Educator)

This assignment is based on largely on the similarity between the Task information in Part 10 of the OCA Form Part A with those for this O\*NET title. Please note in particular the O\*NET Tasks “Design, develop, select, test, implement, and evaluate new or modified informatics solutions, data structures, and decision-support mechanisms to support patients, health care professionals, and their information management and human-computer and human-technology interactions within health care contexts.” and “Use informatics science to design or implement health information technology applications for resolution of clinical or health care administrative problems.”
